Proof-of-certificate program completion via TAT (Truckers Against Trafficking)

Kansas Statute K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 8-2, 157

Per Kansas statute K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 8-2, 157, anyone applying for a new or renewed CDL—class A, B, or C—must show proof of having completed the Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT) certification program. A CDL holder may complete any of the current TAT certificate programs (across multiple industries) or may have completed our Certified Trucker Against Trafficking (CTAT) course or our former Busing on the Lookout (BOTL) course. Presentation of the corresponding certificate may serve as proof, in either physical form or digital form (such as a screenshot image), that a driver has completed the program.

There are many versions of acceptable TAT certificates, including the current certificate iterations (to the right), as well as past iterations (on the back of this flyer). If you are presented with a certificate similar to any of these versions, and are unsure of its validity, please feel free to contact us.





